



Case Study: Olmsted Medical Center



Olmsted Medical Center (OMC), a not-for-profit organization, has been southeastern Minnesota's hometown healthcare provider since 1949. OMC's 160 clinicians and 1,000 healthcare professionals serve at 16 locations, including a multi-specialty clinic, a Level IV trauma hospital with walk-in urgent care and 24-hour emergency room, two FastCare retail clinics in Rochester Shopko stores, and 10 community branch clinics.

OMC has more than 20 specialties and is best known for its convenient, quality

personal primary care. Each year, the Olmsted Medical Center team sees 250,000 patients, performs 3,000 major surgical operations, cares for 38,000 patients in their Emergency and Urgent Care Departments, and delivers 1,000 babies.

Striving for innovation, OMC's Research Department supports clinical research, and the organization participates in the education of medical, nursing, technical, and other students from a variety of institutions, as well as continuing education for staff.

Proteus

Olmsted Medical Center purchased Proteus in 2001 to meet the maintenance management needs of their medical center. They also purchased the Proteus Alarm Interface module to integrate with their Johnson Controls Building Automation System.
